The PetSaver™ Program is an eight hour, hands on course that allows students a chance to practice each skill as it is taught. This effective, repetitive teaching style seals in knowledge so students feel comfortable to handle any pet emergency that may arise.

Students learn CPR and rescue breathing and a multitude of prevention and wellness procedures for their four legged friends, including:

- 🐾 Restraining & Muzzling
- 🐾 Choking Management
- 🐾 Seizures
- 🐾 Bleeding & Shock
- 🐾 Assessing Pet Vitals
- 🐾 Heat & Cold Injuries
- 🐾 Insect Bites & Stings and Snakebites
- 🐾 Snout-To-Tail Assessment for Injury & Wellness
- 🐾 Primary Pet Assessment
- 🐾 Caring For Your Senior Pet-izen

Each student receives a resource booklet with all material covered in class and a quick-apply felt muzzle. Students also get a two year certificate upon completion.

According to the American Animal Hospital Association **1-out-of-4** more pets would survive if just **one** pet first aid technique was applied prior to getting emergency veterinary care.
